Sample Educational Philosophy Statement Sample #1 My Philosophy Statement on Education I believe that each child is a unique individual who needs a safe, caring and stimulating atmosphere to grow and mature emotionally, intellectually, physically and socially. It is our desire as an educator to help students reach their full potential in this field by providing a safe, risk-taking, and encouraging ideas to share. There are three factors that can help create such an environment: (1) a teacher who acts as a guide, (2) the natural curiosity of a child to lead his/her learning, and (3) respecting everyone and everyone. When a teacher's role serves as a guide to providing access to information rather than acting as a primary source of information, finding knowledge is met while learning to answer students' questions. Students need the opportunity to discover themselves and practice their skills in true situations in order to build knowledge. Providing students with access to hands-on activities and allowing them the appropriate time and space to use materials that enhance the lessons they study, there are opportunities for individual discovery and knowledge building. Equally important to self-discovery is the opportunity to study your life, your interests, and the things that are meaningful and relevant. Develop a curriculum that concerns students to promote intrinsic motivation and stimulate a passion for learning. One way to learn in a way that is relevant to your interests is to invite student conversations about classes and learning units. Given the opportunities to enter, students have set a goal to create ideas and do much richer activities than I can create or imagine. When students take ownership of the curriculum, they are motivated to work hard and acquire the skills they need to achieve their goals. Helping students develop a deep love and respect for themselves, others, and the environment is a result of open idea sharing and a sensible approach to discipline. Each student's voice is heard and the environment evolves, giving students the freedom to express themselves. Class meetings are one way to encourage such conversations. I believe that children have greater respect for teachers and colleagues, and the lessons presented when they feel safe and are sure of what they expect. At first, students show respect for their existence and time by establishing fair and consistent rules and revealing the importance of all activities. In turn they learn to respect themselves, others, and their environment. Teaching on your own provides opportunities for continuous learning and growth. One of the motivations as an educator is to share students' passion for learning and instill a love of learning. I think we need a compassionate, strong, and dedicated individual. About working with children. In a highly competitive society, it is important for students to not only have a solid education, but also to work with people who are aware of and sensitive to their individual needs.
